



#### **GENERAL ADMISSION RULES**

BA/B.Com/B.Sc. is an under graduate degree course spread over three years. The number of seats is limited to 80 in each discipline (Subject) purely on the basis of 10+2 merit. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.

Any gap in academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence. (Attach Self Declaration)

Registration fee of Rs.50/- is to be paid to fill the online admission form.

# ONLINE APPLICATION FORM MUST BE FILLED PROPERLY, COMPLETE IN ALL RESPECTS AND SUBMITTED ALONG WITH THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS (WHEREVER NECESSARY):

- 1. Self-attested copy of the character certificate from the institution last attended.
- 2. Self-attested copy of detailed marks-sheet of the previous examination passed.
- 3. Self-attested copy of matriculation examination/date of birth certificate.
- 4. Passport size photographs to be uploaded in the online application form
- 5. Candidates other than H.P board/H.P University must submit
- (a): Eligibility certificate from Board/University declaring equivalence .
- (b): Migration certificate from Board/University from where, they have passed the previous examination.
- 6. For SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/LIG- certificate signed by class one magistrate/competent authority.

- 7. All girl candidates have to submit a copy of Bonafide Himachal Certificate to avail the benefit of relaxation from tuition fee as per government notification number E.D.N.-H(8)3(7)1/76 dated 29-6-2001.
- 8. A student must produce all original certificates at the time of physical verification.
- 9. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate.
- 10. Any other certificates i.e. Sports/Extra-Curricular activities.
- 11. Students with special needs with more than 40% disability will not charged any fees and funds as per Judgment of Hon'ble High Court of HP on dated 04-06-2015, in CWPILNo. 30 of 2011, tittled- "Court on its Own Motion Vs State of HP & Others" and instruction contained in Principal Secretary (Education) to the Govt. of HP vide letter No.EDN-A-Kha(15)7/2019, dated 20-11-2010.
- 12. A passport size photograph of the parents / guardians to be uploaded in PTA membership form in online admission application. (Guardian means only blood relation but not a student of this college) Only parents can be the members/office-bearer of PTA executive)
- 13. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- 14. Admission will be according to latest HPU roster.
- 15. Rules for admission are subject to change as per the HPU notifications from time to time.
- 16. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete / wrong/false information for in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- 17. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during the past years.
- **Initially, all admissions will be provisional** (i.e. Subject to the approval by HP University).

#### **RULES OF MIGRATION**

A student can migrate from one college to another after completing 1 year. Inter institution migration (including from one college to another as well as from a college to the ICDEOL and Vice-versa) students will be allowed when no objection is obtained from both the relieving and receiving Institution (signed by their respective principals) to ascertain the subject combinations available in the college.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE**

The directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh issued in its letter no. EDN-H(8)-Misc.-L/(NEP-2020) dated 26.02.2020, regarding implementation of National Education Policy (NEP-2020) across all the colleges in the state. Since then, all the stakeholders across the state were preparing the policy documents for effective implementation of NEP-2020 from the academic session 2025-26. Therefore, it is pertinent to mention here that all the content mentioned in this prospectus-cumhandbook of information related to admission, syllabus, examination and scheme for CBCS etc. will be governed by the rules and regulation of NEP-2020 in the state (if implemented).

#### GENERAL ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION IN UG COURSES

The admission will be on the basis of the marks obtained in 10+2 or equivalent examination.

The reservation of seats will be according to the instructions issued by the H.P. University, Shimla.

The number of seats in each discipline / subject is limited. The candidate will be considered only if he/she is eligible for admission in that course.

The candidate seeking admission in first year should choose his/her Discipline Specific Course (DSC-1) very carefully as he/she will be automatically allotted the SEC's of that discipline for the completion of degree with a specific subject.

Age Limit: For the admission in the UG classes, the applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 01-07-2025 and must have not born earlier to 01-07-2002. However in case of over-age candidate, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to 6 months. In case of scheduled Caste/Scheduled tribe students, relaxation up to 3 years is allowed as per rules.

#### **BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A. PASS COURSES)**

10+2 examination or an examination equivalent to a Board / University established by law in India with four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks.

Student seeking admission to B.A. 1st year with Mathematics as one of the subject of study, should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.

#### **BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (B.COM. PASS COURSE)**

10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 45% marks or 40% for those who have passed +2 examination under Commerce Group.

For admission to B.Com. Part-I, the minimum eligibility condition for girl students only shall be 33% marks in +2 examination under 10+2 of any recognized Board.

For arts and science stream, the candidate must have passed Maths / Economics as a compulsory subject at his/her 10+2 stage.

#### **BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.SC. PASS COURSE)**

10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) with 45% marks. Regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to the H.P. University for period not less than 3 academic years (and not more than 5 academic years), passed the examination prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have been prescribed there for.

For the degree (B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of Course work for a bachelor's degree over a minimum of 3 years and maximum of 5 years from the date of admission. Provided that not more than 3 attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

#### **FEES/ FUNDS/ FINES**

- 1. Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
- a) A student will have to pay dues at the time of admission.
- b) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Re. 1/day.
- c) In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of that month.
- d) Registration fee will not be charged from a student migrating from another college if he/she is already registered with HP University. Other dues will be charged accordingly as per rules.
- 2. Every student will have to procure No Dues Certificate from the Library, College canteen, Fee Clerk etc. if he/she wants to leave the college.
- 3. The Principal can expel a student from the College if he/she is found guilty of misconduct/ indiscipline/ ragging.

- 4. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
- 5. The fine for absence has to be paid along with dues, while fine imposed otherwise have to be deposited by the date announced in the college office/fee counter.
- 6. Contribution towards **PTA fund Rs. 600/-** per student (to be paid at the time of admission).
- 7. No tuition fee is charged from the Bonafide Himachali girls students, subject to production of HP Bonafide Certificate at the time of admission.
- 8. Students having more than 40% disability are exempted from tuition fee.
- 9. Migration Fee: Rs. 500/-.

#### LEAVE RULES

- 1. General leave rules:-
- a. A tutor can recommend leave up to 6 days; for longer duration i.e. up to 10 days, a student must get the application signed by the Senior Tutor.
- **b.** Leave during House Examination/ Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Senior Tutor.
- **c.** Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- 2. Duty Leave Rules:- Participation by the students in Sports/ Cultural/ Co-Curricular activities, Inter-College/ University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition(s). Duty leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity In-charge, prior proceeding to the event.

#### **CHANGE OF SUBJECT**

The change in one subject (DSC subject) is permissible in the 1<sup>st</sup> year only that too within 15days of admission. Student may submit an application for change of subject to the Principal. The change of DSC subject will be allowed subject to availability of seats and subject combination.

One seat over & above is reserved for Single Girl Child (only child of parents, that too a girl). For seeking admission against this seat parents will have to submit an affidavit in support their claim.

#### CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The Himachal Pradesh University vide letter no. 2-1/2012 H.P.U (Academics) dated 4<sup>th</sup> June, 2016, has adopted the Choice Based Credit System in all the colleges of Himachal Pradesh. The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective / minor or skill based courses. The choice based credit system not only offers opportunities and avenues to learn core subjects but also exploring additional avenues of learning beyond the core subjects for holistic development of an individual.

#### OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

**Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course**: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

**Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

**Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

**Generic Elective Course (GEC):** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Course.

A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

**Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

**Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**: These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

**Contact Hours**: Each course has 5 lectures and 1 tutorial per week in case of DSC, DSE and GEcourses. Each course has 4 lectures and 2 Practical per week in case of SEC courses.

**Duration of Study**: This is a three year course. The degree will be awarded when a candidate clears all courses within a maximum period of five years from the date of admission to this course.

Note: A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subject/paper and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. Two chances (one at supplementary stage and one at the annual exam stage) will be given to clear the compartment. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as "FAILED" in that year and will be required to repeat the entire year.

#### **COURSE EVALUATION**

All Courses (Core and Elective) offered by Department will have an evaluation system that comprises of the following two components:

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course.

End-of-Year Examination (EYE) accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

A student will have to secure a minimum of 35% in both the components i.e. CCA and EYE separately and 40% in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

Classroom Attendance- Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% attendance Lectures/Tutorials. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-of-Year Examination (EYE).

### POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

The college is running M.A. classes in English, Hindi, History and Political Science. The admission for these courses will be on the basis of entrance test to be conducted by the H.P. University. The number of seats in MA is 30 in each subject. The merit is decided according to the latest HPU roaster. Upper age limit is 26 years for the boys and 28 years for the girls (29 years in case of SC/ST boys and girls) as on 01-07-2025 and must have not born earlier to 01-07-1999.

The students have to take two **GE** Papers/Courses in Semester 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> offered by other Departments under the Scheme of Generic Elective. These Papers will be of 8 credits (4 credits each).

The marks scheme for each paper/course is as follows:

Total Marks: 100 (Theory 80, Internal Assessment 20) Passing Marks: 40 (Theory 32, Internal Assessment 08)

The Internal Assessment for Regular Students will comprise: Attendance 5 marks, Assignment/Presentations 15 marks.

The Internal Assessment for ICDEOL students will comprise 20 marks for Assignments.

No Internal Assessment for Private candidates (Only Theory of 100 marks) A student shall have to secure at least 40 percent marks in each paper (Theory as well as Internal Assessment) to quality the examination.

## **CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE**

The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rustication on any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below.

- 1. Any act of ragging on the campus will be severely dealt with Ragging implies harassment/physical or mental torture to another student by a student or a group of students. Any student found associated in such nefarious activities will be held guilty of gross misconduct. Remember Ragging is a cognizable offence.
- 2. Anybody found guilty of writing obscene language, words on blackboard, walls or furniture of the college.
- 3. Aimlessly loitering in the verandas, making noise or attempting to disturb classes.
- 4. Smoking or consumption of alcohol/drugs etc. in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Bringing unwanted outsider persons to the campus or sitting unnecessary on the passage to the campus.
- 6. Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without the permission of Principal.
- 7. Mobile phone should be on switch off mode in classes and on silent mode outside classes/college campus. Indiscipline on campus will not be tolerated.
- 8. Students who participate in sports or other-curricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
- 9. Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card which is issued to him/her at the time of admission. He/she must produce the identity card when- ever demanded by any teacher or the principal.
- 10. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.

### COLLEGE LIBRARY & TUTORIAL GROUPS

The college has spacious library, where students can study newspapers and books etc. in their free time.

## **Library Rules:**

- 1. A student must bring his/her library card to get the books issued in his/her name.
- 2. Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days.
- 3. Reference Books/ Dictionaries/ Newspapers/ Periodicals will not be issued.
- 4. If the issued books are not returned by due date, fine at the rate of Rs.1 per book per day will be charged.
- 5. In case of loss or damage of any issued book, it will either be replaced or its payment of the present cost will be accepted only with the permission of Principal.

#### LIBRARY CARD

**Library Card is an important document, a student must carry every day.** In case of loss of Card, an application to the Principal along with **payment of Rs 50/-duplicate library-Card** will be issued. Library Card should be collected from the Librarian as per schedule notified by the librarian.

## CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Education is a very broad term and goes beyond training of one's mind for acquiring textual knowledge. It is associated with other activities in order to bring about multi-dimensional development of the overall personality of a man. The college provides such opportunities to our students through many co-curricular and other activities that help them to develop a sound body and mind. Our college has many societies like Science Society, Social Science Society, Red Ribbon Club and Eco Club etc. Students are encouraged to join these societies as per their interest. Students can approach the incharges of these societies for enrolment and participation in various activities conducted by them.

## **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)**

The College runs NSS program to inculcate the quality of leadership, social service and discipline, among the youth. The student who attend 240 hrs of social service and attend one special camp for 7 days, are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission to H.P. University Courses.

#### **ROVERS AND RANGERS**

The college runs Rovers & Rangers, aims to contribute to the development of the young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials as individuals.

### **ECO CLUB**

The Eco Club of the college works with an aim to spread awareness regarding the environment among the students. Tree plantation drives, awareness activities such as rallies, educational trips, quiz and poster making competitions, etc. are organized to sensitize the students towards environment related issues.

### **RED RIBBON CLUB**

With the aim of spreading awareness about HIV and AIDS among students, the Government of India initiated the formation of Red Ribbon Clubs in schools and colleges. The primary objective of the club is to create awareness and to induce the spirit among youth to help and support and support people living with HIV/AIDS thereby reducing stigma and discrimination. The objective is to motivate youth and build their capacity as peer educators and agents of change. The club also promotes voluntary blood donation among youth.

### **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

The college publishes its own magazine "Chandrika" to unleash the creative potential of its students. Every section of the magazine is edited by a staff member and assisted by student editor.

### CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell guide the students for various career and job oriented opportunities. The Cell also arranges campus interviews of various multinational companies and organizes special lectures on Personality Development.

## COLLEGE STUDENTS CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)

The members of CSCA are elected as per the rules and regulation of H.P. University every year. The CSCA plays a pivotal role in organizing various, academic and co-curricular activities. Every year CSCA Cultural Meet is organized.

### WOMEN GRIEVANCES & REDRESSAL CELL

This cell is especially established to take care of women grievances and their redressal. The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to be made to the Principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint / appeal. The appeal will be placed before the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC), chaired by College Principal.

# PARENT TEACHER'S ASSOCIATION (PTA)

There is a Parent Teacher's Association which plans and undertakes developmental works in the college. The PTA is run by the Executive Committee which is empowered to take all the decisions. During the previous session 2023-24, PTA played a significant role in the smooth functioning of the college.

# **IQAC CELL**

The college had established IQAC cell for the Quality Assurance & Improvement in Teaching-Learning process. The IQAC through its proactive initiatives indentifies the key strategic areas of focus through the development and monitoring the parameters for excellence in quality. The IQAC aims to engage student representatives in its constitution to facilitate direct inclusion of the student community in the broad policy framework of the college.

## YOGA, HEALTH AND FITNESS CLUB

The college has a Yoga, Health and Fitness Club to promote the importance of a healthy lifestyle among the students and faculty of the college. Regular activities such as yoga practice sessions, meditation sessions, and athletic activities are organized by the club to encourage an active lifestyle and to help students with stress and anxiety issues.

### ANTI-RAGGING/ INDISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2001; 16<sup>th</sup> May, 2007 and 11<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2009 has directed as under:

- 1. Ragging is banned in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
- a. Imprisonment, fine or both.
- b. Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or class for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- c. Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- d. Debarring from representation in events.
- e. Withholding of results.
- f. Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
- 4. If the individual committing or abetting ragging is not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted.
- 5. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behaviour to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
- 6. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, his/her admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.

Note: In case of any emergency, the student(s) may contact any member of the Anti- Ragging cum Discipline Committee.
